KATE e.V.

KATE is a non-profit organization that has set itself the goal of helping shape a sustainable world responsibly through educational work in the areas of environment and development. For over 20 years, KATE e.V. has been coordinating the Berlin Development Education Program (benbi), a diverse offer for students from Grade 3 – 13. In this program, Berlin NGOs get direct access to schools and offer 90-minute workshops on their areas of expertise. Further, the KATE projects "Climate Breakfast", "Mobile Phone", and "A Good Life for All" illustrate how everyday consumption habits influence people and the environment and what global effects they have. "On The Run From The Climate" is the latest module in this context and illustrates the effects of climate change on migratory movements. KATE was significantly involved in the organization of the Berlin Climate Future Conferences, at which young activists and students from the Fridays for Future movement, among others, learn, exchange and network. The Berlin promotional agency for global learning has been part of KATE e.V. since 2019. Here, NGOs have been strengthened for more intensive cooperation with the Berlin schools and anchoring global learning in school development processes.

The Project

The project "A Good Life for All ?! - The global consequences of our way of life using the example of everyday consumer goods" builds on KATE's many years of experience in various project areas. Based on a problem situation, e.g. land grabbing in the context of raw material extraction, several social, ecological, and economic consequences, such as human rights violations, environmental damage, and loss of agricultural land, are described in connection with everyday consumer goods. Using global learning methods, schoolchildren and extracurricular youth groups are introduced to the complex topic, a change of perspective is made possible and options for action are jointly developed for adopting sustainable



consumption habits and contributing to a global community based on solidarity. For this purpose, educational offers appropriate for the target group are designed and media contributions are developed together with young people.

Task Description

In the project, a module for young people between the ages of 13 and 16 is being developed that deals with the concept of the imperial way of life and alternatives based on solidarity. Parts of the educational materials are to be designed with illustrated pictures. For this, we are looking for a person with a Southern perspective, who enjoys illustrating or drawing, and who can bring in ideas to depict topics such as world trade, globalization, and overload limits in pictures for young people. We also welcome you to bring in your ideas in the concept development.

Requirements

- Southern perspective
- Enjoy drawing or designing pictures to a thematic focus
- Knowledge in the fields of global justice, climate justice, degrowth, resistance movements, colonialism, and other development issues
- Experience with approaches of power-sensitive or anti-discriminatory and prejudice-conscious pedagogy
- Confident working with MS-Office tools and web applications
- A structured and reliable way of working
- Participation in voting meetings, online or in the KATE office in Berlin

Desirable Experience

- Experience in the conceptualization and implementation of educational offers for young people in the area of global learning / education for sustainable development
- Experience in graphic / media design
- Experience in project work of NGOs/NPOs
- Experience in dealing with post-colonial and power-critical issues in global learning
- Creative approaches in educational work
